Obtaining a Clicker Remote

You are in a course that uses the Student Response System (clickers) in class. Your instructor has loaned you a clicker remote for the semester.

- The remote [Clicker Keypad] is a small device. **It is your responsibility to take care of this device throughout the semester.**
- If you have dropped the course, return it promptly to the instructor. Do not wait till the end of the semester.

Registering the Clicker for Class Use

You may need to register your clicker to ensure proper record of your responses during class. Some instructors may use these clicker responses for attendance, class participation grades or assessment scoring that affects your grade. Make sure you register your Clicker, if required by the instructor. You only need to register once.

iClicker

- Visit the Blackboard course
- Select “Clickers” from the main course menu
- Select “iClicker – Register you clicker”
- Enter your information very carefully. The remote ID number is found at the back of the clicker. It is a series of 8 numbers and letters on the white sticker on the bottom of your clicker.
- Hit Submit.

Turning Technologies

- Visit the Blackboard course
- Select “Clickers” from the main course menu
- Select “TurningPoint – Register you clicker”
- Enter your information very carefully. The remote ID number is found at the back of the clicker.
- Hit Submit.

If for some reason you change to a different clicker during the semester, you need to re-register using the same steps.

Caring for your Clicker

Once you have checked out a clicker, it is your responsibility to take care of the device throughout the semester.

- The Clicker is a small device. Decide where you will store this device – a special compartment in your book bag, your purse, etc. that you can always find it, and you will remember to take it to class. Your shirt pocket, jacket pocket, the back pocket of your pants may not be a good idea. The Clicker does not survive the laundry very well.
- The Turning Technologies remote is powered by two new coin cell CR2032 (3.0V) Lithium Batteries and has an average battery life of approximately 12 months. When you press a button and the green light appears, your clicker is responding properly.
- The iClicker remote is powered by three AAA batteries and has an average battery life of approximately 200 hours. A low battery light will appear when they need to be replaced.

You will be responsible for the loss or damage of the Clicker you the same way you are any textbook you checked out.

You will be charged for a replacement cost if you fail to return the Clicker in good working condition at the end of the semester.
